Jacobs Gen Summer Camp Packing List

- 1.) COSTUME: This is optional, of course, but the final evening is MOVIE NIGHT where the students (and staff) are encouraged to dress up as their favorite movie character (nothing controversial, horror or gore, please). The students will get their phones back to be able to take photos with their friends and at our "movie selfie wall".
- 2.) Sleeping Bag and Pillow
- 3.) Modest Pajamas (T-shirt and shorts, pref.)
- 4.) 5-6 changes of comfortable clothes that can be used for sports, outdoor events, etc. (NOTE: Please ensure that your student has appropriate and modest clothing. No shirts showing the midriff will be allowed, spaghetti straps or short-shorts. We will require the youth to change clothes if the workers consent that something is "inappropriate.")
- 5.) Flip Flops (shower shoes) and <u>comfortable walking shoes</u> for sports and outdoor activities *See Note Below
- 6.) Light jacket (the weather in Belgium and atop the mountain in Italy can be cool in the summer)
- 7.) "Messy Clothes" (one set for activities that won't matter if they get ruined)
- 8.) Bible (if you have one if not, we'll give you one don't forget to ask!)
- 9.) Notebook or journal
- 10.) Passports and ID cards: We are told by the US Government to keep passports and military ID cards with us when traveling in Europe. However, the Passports will be locked up in the camp safe. We've never needed the passports, but it is a basic USAREUR rule.
- 10.) Spending Cash: <u>NOTE:</u> personal items such a wallets, ID cards, passports, cash are the responsibility of the teen. We will have a locker in the office to lock up wallets if the teens turn them in there for safe-keeping.
 - A.) T-shirt funds if you did not prepay.
 - B.) Optional Activities, per the registration form for your camp location.
 - C.) We'll have an in-house concession stand in our new on-site coffee house where we'll be selling soda's, candy, misc. goods, etc. All proceeds go back into camp fund for this and future events.
 - D.) For Brussels, the chocolate demo outing includes samples but the students may want to purchase additional chocolates.
 - E.) We can exchange *small amounts* of cash (\$10 or less) from dollars to Euro at the same rate we get at the bank, but it's better to bring Euro instead of \$.
 - F.) Teens don't *need* extra cash for meals or entrance fees, only for what you'd like them to have for extra things. There are <u>optional</u> activities which require an extra fee. See note below.
- 11.) Toiletries: shampoo, toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant, etc.
- 12.) 2 Towels (for showers), washcloths (per how many you usually use in 5 days)
- 13.) Camera (Optional. Note, the camp is "unplugged" and youth will only be allowed to use their cell phones as a camera during the final evening
- 14.) PACK LIGHT and compact! We have <u>very little storage space for luggage</u> on the bus.
- 15.) Backpack: Optional, for outings such as the bike trip if the student wishes to bring a camera or water (we do have a water break during the outing as well).

*This year, we have some exciting alternative activities for those who would like to participate. The camp fee covers transportation, lodging, food, and entrance to all group activities. The only additional costs are t-shirt (\$15 or 13 euro, if not purchased in advance), and:

BRUSSELS CAMP (N. EUROPE) – 15 Euro for Brussels chocolate trip, 5 Euro for bike trip

ITALY (S. EUROPE) – 15 Euro for Alpine Coaster and 5 Euro for bike trip
